National Endowment for the Arts Research Awards

The National Endowment for the Arts invites applicants to engage with the agency's five-year research agenda through two funding opportunities for research projects:

- **Research Grants in the Arts** funds research that investigates the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecology or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life. Matching/cost share grants of \$10,000 to \$100,000 will be awarded.
- NEA Research Labs funds transdisciplinary research teams grounded in the social and behavioral sciences, yielding empirical insights about the arts for the benefit of arts and non-arts sectors alike. Matching/cost share cooperative agreements of up to \$150,000 will be awarded. Research Grants in the Arts offers grants, and NEA Research Labs offers cooperative agreements.
